CHECKLIST

You may use the forms and instructions in this packet if . . .

- ✓ You are legally married according to Arizona law. (**A.R.S. § 25-101**)
- ✓ You or your spouse either have or *have not* filed a petition for dissolution, legal separation or annulment.
- ✓ You want to try to reconcile (get back together) or resolve the issues in your case with your spouse.

Do not use this packet if . . .

- ✓ You are NOT legally married according to Arizona law. (**A.R.S. § 25-101**)
Paternity/Custody cases are not eligible for Conciliation Court Services.

READ ME: Consulting a lawyer before filing documents with the court may help prevent unexpected results. A list of lawyers you may hire to advise you on handling your own case or to perform specific tasks, as well as a list of court-approved mediators can be found on the Self-Service Center website.

REQUEST FOR CONCILIATION COURT SERVICES

This packet contains court forms and instructions to request Conciliation Court Services prior to filing a petition for dissolution or immediately after filing a petition for dissolution. Items in **BOLD** are forms that you will need to file with the Court. Non-bold items are instructions or procedures. Do not copy or file those pages!

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The documents you have received are copyrighted by the Superior Court of Arizona in Maricopa County. You have permission to use them for any lawful purpose. These forms shall not be used to engage in the unauthorized practice of law. The Court assumes no responsibility and accepts no liability for actions taken by users of these documents, including reliance on their contents. The documents are under continual revision and are current only for the day they were received. It is strongly recommended that you verify on a regular basis that you have the most current documents.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE FORMS AND SUBMIT YOUR “PETITION FOR CONCILIATION COURT SERVICES”

YOU MAY USE THIS PACKET to request Conciliation Court Services before or immediately after filing for dissolution, legal separation, or annulment. If you choose to file a **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services,”** you and your spouse will be **required** to attend a conference conducted by a trained marriage and family professional provided by Conciliation Services at no cost.

- If a petition for dissolution, legal separation or annulment has been filed and the **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** is filed within **60 days of service of the petition**, there will be a hold (or stay) on the proceedings for up to 60 days to allow time for scheduling and attending the conference. The Court may extend this stay for good cause. The process for seeking an extension can be found in Arizona Revised Statute § 25-381.18(B).
- If a **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** has been filed by either party within the previous year, the proceeding will **not** be put on hold.
- A Petition for Divorce, Legal Separation, or Annulment may be dismissed pursuant to A.R.S. § 25-381.18 if filed while a hold (or stay) is in place resulting from filing a Petition for Conciliation Court Services.
- If a party is represented by an attorney, only the attorney can file a **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”**. If a party is represented by an attorney and files a **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** on his/her own, it may be rejected.

INSTRUCTIONS: Complete the **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** as follows:

STEP 1 **USING BLACK INK ONLY, type or neatly print** the information requested in the top left-hand corner of the document. Then, write in the case number (if you have one). Your Superior Court Case Number is the file number of your Family Court case if you have filed for dissolution, legal separation, or annulment. If you or your spouse has not filed for dissolution, legal separation, or annulment, you will not have a Superior Court Case Number.

STEP 2 **Complete the case caption.** If you filed for dissolution, legal separation or annulment, you are the petitioner; if the other party served you with court papers, he or she is the Petitioner. Copy the caption as it appears in the papers you were served with. If the **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** is being filed *before* anyone has filed for divorce, legal separation or annulment, you are the Petitioner.

STEP 3 **Read the “Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** and answer the questions or provide the information requested. Then, date and sign the **“Petition for Conciliation Court Services”** with the current day, month and year. Provide the name, address, and telephone number of your spouse, or your spouse’s attorney (if he or she has one).

STEP 4 **If you are requesting Conciliation Court Services before or immediately after filing for** divorce, legal separation or annulment case and have completed the Petition for Conciliation Court Services; take the original and 3 copies to the Office of the Clerk of the Superior Court to be filed. The Clerk will file the original and stamp your 3 copies. Mail or hand deliver one copy to Conciliation Services at the locations below, send one copy to the other party, and keep one copy for your records.

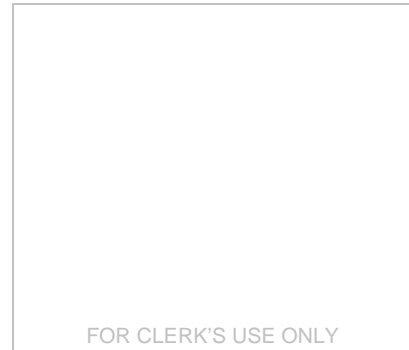
