PREA AWARENESS

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO FEEL SAFE NO MATTER WHERE YOU ARE.

Maricopa County Juvenile Probation Department has a **zero tolerance policy** for harassment of any kind.

This policy applies to youth, Detention Staff, Counselors, Medical Professionals, Contracted Professionals & Workers, Religious Personnel, Volunteers, and Visitors.

Use the informational tools in this brochure to be mindful of your surroundings, actions, and to help protect yourself and others. **If you see something, say something.**

REMEMBER... "NO" MEANS NO.

WHAT IS PREA?

PREA stands for Prison Rape Elimination Act and is a Federal Law that was enacted in 2003 to stop sexual abuse and harassment in Detention Facilities.

WHAT IS SEXUAL ABUSE & HARASSMENT?

Sexual abuse and harassment can happen to people of all ages, all genders, all ethnic groups, social or economic status, sexual orientation or disability.

Sexual abuse and harassment...

- ...is about power and violence.
- ...can mean unwanted touching or gesturing.
- ...can be unwanted, repeated verbal abuse.

WHAT IS CONSENT?

While consensual sex in a Detention setting is illegal, it is important to understand what consent is. Consent is giving permission or agreeing to something* in order to protect yourself and others. Youth in detention cannot give consent for sex with another youth or with staff.

***Consensual sex in a detention setting is illegal; therefore all sexual contact (physical or verbal) is considered non-consensual and will fall under MCJPD's Zero Tolerance Policy.**

INFORMATION ON REPORTING

If you are experiencing or witness sexual abuse or harassment, follow one of the methods below to report.



Speak with a trusted staff, volunteer, clergy, or other trusted adult know as soon as you can.

We are here to listen and will take action on all reports.



Call 1-888-767-2445 or any of the Crisis Hotline Phone Numbers. Ask staff to make a private phone call to report something. Phone lists are available in all areas of detention.



Fill out and turn in a Grievance Slip. Ask our staff for a Grievance Slip, mark the PREA box on the Grievance Slip, and place in designated area for the PREA staff.



NOTES ABOUT FALSE REPORTING

- False reporting hurts innocent people.
- False reporting pulls resources from real emergencies.
- If false reporting is intentional, there could be consequences including legal action.



HAVING HEALTHY BOUNDARIES

Healthy boundaries between yourself, other youth, officers, and staff is important for the safety of everyone.

- Do not share your personal information, social media handles, or case information.
- Be conscious of oversharing and mindful of personal space.
