




NEW FILING PERCENTAGE CHANGE

TERMINATED FILING PERCENTAGE CHANGE








NEW FILINGS BY LOCATION




10 YEAR JUDICIAL OFFICER HISTORY

Clearance Rates (Terminated/New Filings)*100




CIVIL AGE OF PENDING


CIVIL TIME TO DISPOSITION




RISK LEVEL DISTRIBUTION

Assessed Risk Level for the Supervised Probation Population




PRETRIAL SUPERVISION POPULATION

Average number of individuals on Pretrial Supervision




ADMINISTRATIVE PRISON POPULATION




FUGITIVE APPREHENSION UNIT (OPEN WARRANTS)

Average number of individuals on probation with open warrants during the Fiscal Year








NEW FELONY CONVICTIONS

Percentage and number of supervised individuals with new felony convictions for crimes committed while on probation






YOUTH REFERRALS

Citations and Custody Status of Youth at the Time of Referral






OFFENSE TYPE FOR YOUTH REFERRALS






Average Daily Population and Length of Stay






Proportion of youth who successfully completed Diversion and were not referred for a new delinquent offense within the following 365 days

Proportion of youth who completed supervision and were not referred for a new delinquent offense within the following 365 days










History of Operating (Recurring) Expenses by Expense Category with Total



History of Operating (Recurring) Expenses for <u>Direct Services</u> by Department







In FY22 more than \$5M in operating budget savings from other areas was used for technology purchasing, some of which was one-time in nature.


History of <u>One-Time</u> Expenses by Department


FY 23 <u>Direct Services Operating</u> (Recurring) ADOPTED Expense Budget by Department Direct Services Grand Total = \$258.62M

RETIREMENT ELIGIBLITY




